Inu Shrine (伊奴神社)

I am living in the city of Ichinomiya for four years now, and love visiting unique sightseeing spots. One of my favorite places is Inu Shrine located in Nishi ward of Nagoya. It is an interesting place to visit especially during the New Year holidays. My husband often offers his services as a priest at this shrine and I have volunteered in selling charms during the busy holiday time.

Legend has it that Emperor Tenmu visited and harvested rice in the area surrounding the shrine in the year 673, and this Shinto shrine came into existence around that time. Although Inu Shrine is dedicated to three deities I will only mention one of the deities named Inuhime-no-kami who is associated with safe delivery during childbirth and also for good health of children. So this shrine is very popular with expecting women. Another interesting point is that since the name of the shrine is 'Inu', it is a beloved spot amongst people having dogs as pets. This is because the Japanese word for dog is 'Inu'. However, it is just the phonetic pronunciation of 'Inu' that is similar, and actually the Japanese character for dog is different than that of the shrine. About three decades back, the shrine management used this play of homophonic words to popularize the shrine, which has worked out very well. Many people from in and around Aichi area visit this shrine throughout the year and visitors can buy cute dog shaped lucky charms.

I often get confused with the correct way of offering prayers at Japanese shrines and temples. This inevitably leads to me praying in Indian way. Sometimes it is a bit embarrassing as I am a Shinto priest's wife but I hope to improve with time.

Inu Shrine is a quiet and peaceful spot and definitely worth a visit.
